Ballon d'Or 2023: Erling Haaland or Lionel Messi, Who Will Clinch the Coveted Award?

It is near that time of the year, October 30, a day to remember for Soccer fans across the globe □ the much anticipated Ballon d'Or ceremony. With the 2023 nominees introduced on September 26, this year's race is stacked with historically great seasons and talents. However, most analysts have reached the consensus that the two favorites are Manchester City's Erling Haaland and Inter Miami's Lionel Messi. But, who exactly is more deserving of the coveted award?

2023 is a year to remember for Haaland and City fans, as he achieved historical records and simply had overall great team success. Individually, Haaland surpassed Alan Shearer and Andy Coles's 34-goal record, setting a new Premier League record of 36 goals in a season. Furthermore, across the entire 2022-2023 campaign, Haaland had an extremely impressive near 1-to-1 goal-to-appearance ratio, including a total of four hat tricks. From a team perspective, it was a near-flawless season, with Man City winning the treble, only to lose out on the EFL Cup and Community Shield. On the other hand, Haaland's biggest counterargument is his lack of quality in the World Cup and decisive matches. Not only did

he not score in the Champions League (UCL) Finals, but he also only touched the ball a measly 21 times, least among all 22 starters. This is not even mentioning how Norway failed to qualify for the 2022 World Cup. With that said, a treble and a new Premier League record is no short of an amazing season, but now let us have a look at Lionel Messi.

La Pulga, Alien, the Messiah, and the little boy from Rosario are among the many names Lionel Messi has been called. But none have fit him better than the GOAT: Greatest of All Time, solidified by his masterclass performance leading Argentina to their first-ever World Cup Trophy since 1986. Though there may be some bias due to his incredible homecoming story, it is without a doubt that Messi is still among the best players in the world despite having transferred to Inter

At PSG, Messi consistently had a higher performance grade than his two teammates and Ballon d'Or finalists Mbappe and Neymar. To support this, throughout the 2022-23 campaign, Messi had an astonishing 65 goals/ assists at 36 years of age, surpassing even Haaland's 61. Messi also matched Haaland's 1-to-1 goal-to-appearance ratio by scoring 11 goals in 11 games played for Inter Miami, though it is in the Major League Soccer (MLS). Nonetheless, Messi's

cream of the crop is still his World Cup performance, as some of his achievements include four man of the matches, being joint top scorer and assister, as well as being the World Cup Finals most valuable player, scoring a brace. From a team standpoint, Messi won Ligue 1 with PSG, and with Inter Miami, Messi led them to a blistering nine-game win streak, along the way defeating Nashville FC to claim the League Open Cup. Keep in mind, that Inter Miami was a bottom-two team in the Eastern Conference before Messi's arrival. All things considered, now let's compare and contrast, to determine who is the rightful re-

cipient of the Ballon d'Or.

To compare Haaland and Messi, let's first look at the stats. Among the major categories, Haaland leads in goals, but Messi clears in assists, chances, performance grades, and overall consistency. This is a knock at Haaland's poor performance in the UCL finals, so in this category, Messi takes the lead. From a team standpoint, even with how well Inter Miami has performed, it is still incomparable to Man City's treble, so this one easily goes to Haaland. Lastly, on the international stage, Messi completed his promise to give Argentina a World Cup, whereas Haaland's Norway failed even to qualify. Quite

literally stating the obvious, this one goes to Messi. To sum all of that up, Messi clears Haaland in international competitions, whereas Haaland does the same to Messi in domestic once, but ultimately, Messi triumphs slightly in the stats category. Although it's a very close race, and there are plenty of arguments in favor of Haaland, it all comes down to Haaland's lack of success in big moments, whereas Messi thrived. Individually, Messi was simply the better player, hence why Messi is my pick for the 2023 Ballon d'Or, further concluding his GOAT career with his eighth Ballon d'Or.

Jannik Sinner Defeats Daniil Medvedev to Win Beijing Open

In October 2023, 22-yearold Jannik Sinner emerged victorious out of two mentally strenuous matches to win the China Open. This success is mainly due to his consistent groundstrokes and ability to persevere during rallies that last for minutes on end. Defeating both Carlos Alcaraz (20 years old) in the semifinals and Daniil Medvedev (27 years old) in the finals, it has become clear to viewers that a new generation of tennis legends has begun to stake their claim for the title of No. 1 player in the

Approaching the semi-finals in Beijing, it was predicted across the world that the young and up-coming Alcaraz would trounce Sinner. However, this was proved wrong on October 3 when the Italian player emerged victorious with a score of 7-6, 6-1. Sinner's consistent serves and mental fortitude eventually earned him the win. Within this nerve-wracking game, there were a multitude of high-pressure points to which Alcaraz succumbed. Sinner was able to

win five out of eight breakpoints, while the Spanish player only obtained two out of nine. One of his most successful shots was after a long rally of backhands, Sinner would drive the ball down the line into the back corner. After a first set full of points consisting of up to dozens of exchanges, the Italian pulled ahead and won the tiebreaker 7-4. After this loss, Alcaraz was unable to find the mental strength within himself to bounce back. With this surge of confidence, Sinner was ready to face Medvedev in the finals in his quest to win the Beijing Open.

Similarly, to his match against Alcaraz, Sinner pulled off the win by pushing Medvedev mentally. As the game went on, Sinner limited Medvedev's opportunities to gain control over points. This was far from the first time these two players met. Sinner knew far too well what losing to his Russian opponent felt like as he had been previously defeated 6 times already. Since then, Sinner has immensely improved both his mental and physical game, prompting the media to recognize how evenly matched the two players are. Howev-

er, what allowed the Italian to succeed was superior net play and mental resilience during game-altering points. He won the finals 7-6 7-6, both tiebreaks ending in 7-2. During the trophy ceremony, Sinner elaborated on his journey to victory saying, "We have had some very tough battles, especially this year. Thanks for making me a much better player. I have been training a lot to beat you." Despite the

bigger goal of winning the tournament at stake, Sinner considered finally beating his rival as victory enough.

By winning these two entrancing matches, Sinner has staked his name as a serious competitor for the younger generation. After beating the second (Alcaraz) and third seed (Medvedev), there seems to be no one other than Novak Djokovic standing in the way of achieving his ultimate goal

of being the highest-seeded player in the world. It has become apparent that Sinner's relentless mental game will serve him well against any up-and-coming player of his generation. Paired with his multitude of technical strengths, it is certain that a great number of achievements are to follow this incredible win for Sinner.

Who is the GOAT of Baseball?

You know the greats. Babe Ruth. Mike Trout. Barry Bonds. Some of them stole 40 bases while hitting 40 home runs, some of them hit more than 60 home runs in a season, and some of them had a sub 2 ERA. In the one hundred plus years of major league baseball, there have been many greats. It seems like an impossible task to choose the best.

Joe Posnanski, author of The Baseball 100, argued that Wille Mays is the best. ESPN argues that the Great Bambino, Babe Ruth, is the greatest; Jomboy Baseball argues it's Shohei Ohtani. For my rankings, I will use a combination of WAR (wins above replacement), overall OPS+ (a stat that averages OPS, or on-base plus slugging percentages, into a standardized score where 100 is average), and great feats (40-40 season, 60+ home runs, 20 wins in a season). I will be excluding players like Roger Clemens, Barry Bonds, or

Mark McGuire because I think that any feat you have to go to court for after does not count as a feat. I started by pulling up a list of the all-time WAR leaders (it should be noted that pitcher WAR is controversial so pitchers will be separate).

We can see that the top few players according to WAR are Babe Ruth, Willie Mays, Ty Cobb, and Hank Aaron. Each of them has WARs of around 150+. This means that they had to have averaged 10+ WAR for 15 years. For reference, Ronald Acuna Jr., who hit 40 home runs and stole 70 bases, had a WAR of 8.1 this year. I would like to add Nolan Ryan to that list because of the sheer dominance he held over batters for 28 seasons. Of these players, Babe Ruth hit 714 home runs, Willie Mays had more than 3,200 hits and 660 home runs, and Ty Cobb had more than 4,000 hits and almost 900 stolen bases. Hank Aaron hit 755 home runs, had more than 3,700 hits, and holds a record 6,856 total bases. Nolan Ryan struck out 5,714 batters in his 28-season

career (this is around a thousand more strikeouts than second-place Randy Johnson) and tossed 7 no-hitters. He also holds the single-season strikeout record at an incredible 383. He had by far the longest prime which spanned almost his entire career. Ruth had an OPS+ of 206 (meaning for his entire career he was twice as productive as the rest of the league). Mays held an OPS+ of 155 while Cobb rocked a 168. Aaron had an OPS+ of 155 as well. Ryan held an ERA+ (a stat similar to OPS+ in which it standardized ERA) of 112 with one season with a whopping 195

Considering these different categories, it can be easy to go with Babe Ruth or Ty Cobb, although I feel like baseball back then was so much different than what it is today. Pitchers threw slower, and the spitball was still prominent. Willie Mays is arguably the greatest allaround player, as he had stellar defense as well as offense, but Aaron clearly stands out as the greatest offensive player. He

cord that stood until Barry Bonds concluded his juiced-up career and hit an incredible 3,700 hits. There are just 4 players in the 3000-hit 700-homerun club, and Aaron clearly stands out. For this reason, I would say Hank Aaron is the GOAT of baseball. It is worth noting that Nolan Ryan is easily the greatest pitcher of all time. He basically invented the concept of a power pitcher. His records and feats stand alone; he is the greatest pitcher

of all time. Time will tell if Ohtani has enough resilience to injury to have the career he is hyped up to have. The conclusions of Aaron Judge and Mike Trout's careers could also influence the list. While I do not expect you to entirely agree with my position, raw stats, and achievements easily point to Hank Aaron being on top. He is the GOAT.



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The Quest to Maintain Superstar Status: Will LeBron Finally Crumble?

At age 38, there has been much speculation regarding LeBron James' expected performances in this upcoming season. However, it can be guaranteed that being the oldest person in the NBA will not stop James from putting up the superstar numbers he has been doing for the past 20 seasons. Having aged like fine wine, season 21 should be a breeze

Born to a 16 year old single mother, LeBron's life has not always been smooth sailing. With an absent father, it was his basketball coach who would take him under his wing as he pursued both football and basketball. With a strong support system behind him, James was able to excel and gain national recognition, in both sports. Eventually opting for basketball, James was drafted as the #1 pick in the 2003 NBA draft. Despite hardships such as having to miss school or constantly having to move from place to place, he has consistently shown grit and a strong work ethic. Even with the crushing expectations brought upon him as an 18-year-old

rookie, he was able to live up to the hype consistently and has solidified himself on the "Basketball Mt. Rushmore", even debatably being the greatest ever to do it.

First, we can look at the statistics part of the equation. Throughout his 20 NBA seasons, LeBron James has averaged a staggering 27.2 ppg (points per game), 7.5 rpg (rebounds per game), 7.3 apg (assists per game), 1.5 spg (steals per game), and 0.8 bpg (blocks per game). By being able to excel at multiple different things, LeBron can make a profound impact on all aspects of the game. In fact, he is the all-time leader in points scored, fourth in all-time assists, and ninth in steals as a forward. The easiest way to speculate the statistics he will be able to put up this upcoming season is by looking at last season's stats. Last season, LeBron averaged a whopping 28.9 ppg, 8.3 rpg, 6.8 apg, 0.9 spg, 0.6 bpg. One could argue that he was chasing the coveted scoring record, but that does not discredit the amazing impact he had in the games. For a larger sample size, we can look at his Lakers tenure. In five years, he averaged 27.4 ppg, 8.1 rpg, 8.0 apg, 1.2 spg,

and 0.7 bpg, enough to push him to all-star captain selections all five years. All these stats become evidence of Lebron's incredible stats and their immediate success, including the past few years. In fact, compared to his stats two years ago, his last season's stats increased in every single category except for ppg and defensive metrics.

Second, we can look at the team put around him this season. It can be said

that this year's team is far superior to most of his past teams, even the roster when he won the championship with the Lakers in 2020. With great trade acquisitions over the trade deadline last season, the Lakers were able to make a late playoff run to the Western Conference Finals, where they would get swept by the Nuggets. Players such as Rui Hachimura, D'Angelo Russell, Jarred Vanderbilt, Malik Beasley, and Mo Bamba. This offseason, the Lakers organization made great moves. Despite losing key players such as Dennis Schoder or Lonnie Walker IV, they were able to add great additions such as Gabe Vincent (3yr \$33 Million), Christian Wood (2yr \$5.7 Million), Taurean Prince (1yr \$4.5 Million), Jaxson Hayes (2yr \$4.6 Million), and Cam Reddish (2yr

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The LA Rams Passing Attack: Will Kupp, Nacua, and Stafford Be Unstoppable?

The Los Angeles Rams were assumed by many people to be one of the worst teams in the league coming into the 2023 NFL season. However, a little more than a third of the way into the season, the Sean McVay led squad is sitting at 3-3, a very acceptable record for a team that, after their Super Bowl victory two seasons ago, was predicted to fall apart quickly. A lack of draft capital and an older core group of players meant that they were in a prime position for a regression. Last season certainly displayed this regression with a 5-12 season after their 12-5 performance the season prior. The downward tumble was to continue, or so sports media said.

But the Rams aren't counting themselves out yet. Led by veteran quarterback Matthew Stafford, the Rams are the executors of one of the most productive passing attacks in the NFL. The passing offense of the Rams has yielded 1,677 yards from Stafford's arm six games into the season for an average of 279.5 yards a game. That total yardage number is good enough for the 3rd most productive quarterback in the league. But why has

an aging Stafford been able to be so successful? What factors contribute

The biggest one this season has clearly been Stafford himself. His arm has been on fire. He's been rifling the ball into tight windows and reading the field with accuracy and speed, enabling him to use his incredible arm talent to place the ball where it needs to go. Stafford has a history of being a standout quarterback, as anyone who has been watching football for the past decade will know. In seasons where he's been the uninjured starter for the whole season, he's never thrown for less than 4,000 yards. That's consistency.

But Stafford isn't the only reason for the passing success of the Rams. Rookie receivers Puka Nacua and Tutu Atwell have been lighting up scoreboards in Sean Mc-Vay's genius offensive scheme. Nacua has 598 yards through the first six games of the season, averaging almost 100 yards a game. His ability to find holes in zone coverages and settle into them, as well as his size and strength against man coverage, make him an exceptionally easy target to throw to. Atwell's speed makes him a strong deep ball threat, and his shiftiness makes him a dangerous underneath receiver.

And of course, there's perennial superstar Cooper Kupp, creator of one of, if not the greatest, wide receiver seasons of all time. He was injured (as he often is) for the first four games of the season, but for the past two weeks, he has been averaging 133 yards a game with an average yards per catch of 17.7.

The combination of Kupp, Nacua, and Atwell has been and will be a problem for defenses across the league, especially with McVay's unpredictable and usually brilliant offensive mind. I'm excited to tune into Rams games to see the ball fly through the air for the remainder of the sea-



Anticipating the 2023 Head of the Charles: Predictions and Showdown on the Charles River

The largest regatta in the world, taking place since 1965, happens here in Massachusetts on the Charles River. The regatta occurs over three days and brings over 225,000 people to the greater Boston area, to both race and observe the competition. The style of racing that is performed at the Head of the Charles race is called head racing. Across various races, boats are set out by bow number and then are timed by the time that they complete the race. This is a style of racing that is common often in the fall, whereas sprints are common in the spring.

For the Men's Club Eights Race, it will be a tossup between Harvard University and Brown University. These two teams have been going back and forth for the last couple of years, and it will be interesting to see who will come out on top for 2023. 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The NBA's Newest Superteam is Better Than You Think

Damian Lillard and Gi-Antetokounmpo are individually regarded as elite scorers in the NBA and, without a doubt, top 20 players currently. However, there's one more major commonality between the two: neither has ever played with any major star talent. Damian Lillard has been in the league for 11 seasons,

and the last and only time he has played with an All-Star was Lamarcus Aldridge back in 2013-15. But finally, on September 27th, that changed when, in a three-way deal be-tween the Bucks, Blazers, and Suns, the Bucks acquired All-Star and MVP caliber player Damian Lillard. The Suns got Jusuf Nurkic, Grayson Allen, and a couple more guys. But that isn't all too bad. The Suns already have a backcourt made of some

of the best players in the NBA in Devin Booker, Kevin Durant, and Bradley Beal. Last but not least, the Blazers ended up with Deandre Ayton, a player the team traded not long after receiving (Jrue Holiday), and a seventh grader (2029 first round pick). But all of that aside, how good is this win for the Bucks, and more specifically, how good can this new duo be?

This isn't the first time

we've seen a pairing of All-Star talent, and many have tried and failed to create an unstoppable super team: Russ and Harden; Kyrie, KD, and Harden; Kawhi and PG. They never quite live up to the grand expectations given to them, but history shows us that this new duo in Milwaukee is bound to do something great.

Box plus minus is a metric used to determine how positive or negatively impactful a player was on a game due to many factors. There have only been six duos in the history of the NBA that were as good individually as Giannis and Dame are in terms of box plus minus. Out of those six duos, four of them went on to win the NBA championship that season. Last season, Dame and Giannis averaged 32-5-7 and 31-12-6, respectively, both on over 60% true shooting percentage. That is a stat line that only Luka Doncic, James Harden, and Michael Jordan have ever achieved. However, all of this gets swept under the radar because Lillard has spent his career in the shadow of Steph Curry, arguably the greatest point guard in NBA history. These are

2 of the most prolific

scorers in NBA history, and the last time we saw a pairing so dominant was never. There has never been an NBA duo that has had both players average 30 ppg and then played together the following season. Not only that, but their games perfectly complement each other like nothing seen before. A top five interior player gets combined with a top five perimeter shooter, a lethal combination. There is not a single team in the league at the moment that can defensively cover this force. This something that has always held back most attempted super teams, and time and time again, we see that if you match the right players, it makes all the difference. Both Lebron and Wade and Kobe and Shaq, two of the most dominant duos in history, match that description.

Obviously, this is partially speculation but all the stats and accolades beg the question: does this duo have what it takes to win the title? Or are we getting ahead of ourselves like we have done countless times be-

No one's tennis journey is linear. Even one of the greats, Roger Federer, struggled to keep cool during his teenage years of tennis. As mentioned by an ESPN article, "He'd frequently smash his rackets, scream at the sun, and berate himself and others as things failed to plan." He took his anger out on material things and could clearly not control his emotions, a critical factor in becoming a successful tennis player. Later, he started working on his self-control, becoming the gentleman people know him as today. His first breakthrough was when he won the Junior

In 2002, Federer became the first Swiss to reach the top 10 and later won the men's singles Wimbledon tournament. In

future years, he won many more grand slams, winning the Australian Open, Wimbledon, and the U.S. Open many times. From 2004 all the way to 2008, he had to defend his titles by playing many other great players like Novak Djokovic and Rafael Nadal, who competed with him for every title. Some people call them the "Big Three" because they shared the spotlight for many years, dominating the tennis competition.

In 2009, Federer won his only French Open title, easily beating Robin S□derling 6-1, 7-6, 6-4, who beat the king of clay Nadal in the round before. However, in 2013, he struggled with a back injury and could not add to his list of grand slams

until 2017, when he won the Australian Open. He was 35 years old when he won the tournament, becoming the oldest player to win the Australian Open in history. He won it again in 2018 and, after that, started his downfall.

He was injured many times, which led to his retirement. Federer announced that he will retire from competitive tennis after suffering multiple knee surgeries in recent years. The news of his retirement was shocking and pierced through the hearts of millions of devoted fans and supporters who had followed his remarkable journey over the years. The weight of sadness hung on everybody's shoulders. For countless years, Federer

had not merely entertained but also inspired, leaving an indelible mark on the world. According to Celtics owner, Steve Paglucia, Paul Pierce, former Celtic and Hall of Famer, has never seen a better practice than Holiday's first practice with the Celtics, "There was just an electricity in the gym today, when you get such great players together playing at a high level; and Paul Pierce turned to us and said he's never seen an NBA practice like this his whole entire career that they went that hard that fast for that long"

fast for that long."

It appears that Holiday is the perfect piece to the puzzle. He fits the culture of the city and is able to create a spark with his teammates. In addition to being a great leader and mentor for younger players, Holiday

is a two-time All-Star, fivetime All-Defensive, threetime Teammate of the Year, and NBA Champion. However, it all comes at a price. The English summer sun was lukewarm, yet the air was still thick and hot. It was July 1989, and the entire tennis world now revolved around one spot. The grass was cut perfectly, just as it had been for the past century. Class and prestige emanated from every crevice in the court. A 22-yearold Bryan Shelton stood upon a pristine grass court in Wimbledon. He had turned pro just a few months prior and now stood at the grandest stage in the world; across from him was Boris Becker, the youngest Wimbledon champion ever. People crowded the stands, eager to watch Becker dominate the young American. Unfortunately for Shelton, the crowd got exactly what they wanted. After two and a half hours and three sets, Becker left with a place in the next round, and Shelton left with a ticket back to the USA.

Bryan Shelton continued to have an admirable career, falling just short of the tennis player's ultimate dream: the top ten. Although for many this could be where they cut ties with the sport, Bryan's passion denied him that release. He began his second career as a tennis coach in 1999, just over a year after retiring from professional tennis. He coached the Georgia Tech women's team and, in 2007, even mentored them to a national championship. As time went on, Bryan turned his focus from his own career to the future of the Shelton name: his son, Ben Shelton. From the beginning of his son's tennis journey, Bryan knew that Ben was different. A kid normally needs to be pushed to achieve success, but Ben himself was a furnace, roaring with motivation and competitive spirit. In 2022, Bryan told The New York Times that Ben has always been "just a different animal than I was." In fact, Bryan

frequently had to control his son's endless bounds of energy and talent.

Ben Shelton's rise as a junior was unique to someone as athletically capable as him. Unlike many "tennis babies" of the world, he did not experience intense pressure to succeed. In fact, he only started taking tennis somewhat seriously in seventh grade, after he quit football. Despite his lack of international tennis renown, he was still a phenomenal player and earned a spot on the roster at the University of Florida tennis team, where his father transferred to as a coach. Under the tutelage of Bryan, the team won the NCAA National Championship, and that was when the world began to see who this boy was becoming.

4.6 Million) through the free agent market, draft Jalen Hood-Schfino (17th pick) and Maxwell Lewis (40th pick), and sign non-guaranteed contracts such as Colin Castleton, Alex Fudge, and D'Moi Hodge. In fact, the Lakers got so much better that according to sports network Hoops Hype, the Lakers now have the 4th highest power ranking. What does this mean for LeBron? It means less need for minutes and more laidback basketball. Last year, LeBron logged on 35.5 minutes per game, much more than a 38-year-old should be playing. However, with this new team, one can expect LeBron to average a little

bit fewer points, but more assists and rebounds, and more defensive stats like steals and blocks.

Third, we can look at the off-the-court aspect of the equation. This is regarding the work ethic, the Mamba Mentality aspect, and the work he puts into his body and craft. According to some independent sources, LeBron James spends an average annual sum of \$1.5 million on his body. This includes the trainers, home gyms, chefs, massage therapists, and, of course, the super cool ice chambers he goes in. The effort he puts into his craft is also unreplaceable. In the news conference ahead of training camp, Darvin Ham, the Lakers' head coach said in an interview "He [LeBron James] does a great job taking care of himself,". As a 38-yearold, health is of the utmost importance, and being able to take care of himself cannot be discredited. In that same interview, Rob Pelinka, the Lakers' General Manager and Vice President of Basketball Operations, said "It's staggering for a player who has 20 years under the hood already and is preparing for 21 like he's a rookie," and "There has been nothing but an increase in seeing that [Putting work in] here. To me, it's let's be about it. let's not talk about it. He's definitely been about it this offseason.". In the facilities, behind all the paparazzi and media, Ham and Pelinka can see the arduous efforts LeBron undertakes. In an interview with ESPN, a newcomer for the Lakers Christian Wood stated "First person I see is LeBron James. Already in a full sweat ... He already

beat me to it." Christian Wood, who, as a newcomer, wanted to impress and prove his worth, went early in the morning to practice. However, it was, of course, LeBron, being the diligent person he is, already putting his shots up. As such, his work ethic, on and off the court can be credited for his amazing performance on the hardwood.

However, there are some uncertainties that may challenge this equation. There is the possibility of injury. So far, we have discussed that skill wise, there should not be a problem with him replicating the stats from last year. But injuries could be the Achilles heel. Last season, LeBron had a torn foot tendon that sidelined him for 27 games. He also missed 26 and 27 games the two seasons before that, respec-

tively. Hopefully, this season brings good news, and the new additions should help him ease off a little.

Finally, it would only be right to predict LeBron's stats for this upcoming season. Because of his help in fire power, I would expect a decrease in points but an increase in assists. Rebounds should stay the same and the defensive metrics may dwindle a tiny bit. Overall, I would assume a statline of 24~26 ppg, 7~8 rpg, 7~9 apg, and around a steal and 0.75 bpg. Obviously, this all depends on injuries and strategies put forward by the Lakers, but I speculate this would be the ballpark of his stats. These stats will not only maintain LeBron's status as a superstar but will solidify himself as a top ten player in the league at 38 years old and at season 21.



Do The Tottenham Spurs Have a Chance at Winning the Premier League?

At the end of the 2022-23 season, Spurs finished in 8th place in the Premier League after a campaign full of chaos and losses, as Antonio Conte got sacked and Harry Kane left after 14 years at the club. The future seemed bleak for Spurs as their star striker left the club, as well as key players like Lucas Moura.

And yet, here we are. Going into the second international break of the season, Spurs sit top of the Premier League, ahead of the likes of Pep Guardiola's treble-winning Manchester City and Mikel Arteta's Arsenal, all while being undefeated, picking up 20 points out of 24. Spurs' new head coach, Ange Postecoglou, has inspired the team and brought a new team spirit. One question sticks out: Can the Spurs keep their consistency and potentially win the title?

A Trophyless History

The last time Spurs won the English title was in 1961, which was 62 years ago. The last time Spurs won any trophy was in 2008 when they won the League Cup. That was 15 years ago. The last time Spurs were close to winning

the Premier League was in the 2015/16 season when they were in a two-horse race to the title. With whom you may ask? Leicester City, who are now in the EFL Championship.

It is safe to say, Spurs haven't been a 'winning' team in about a decade and a half. They have lost numerous cup finals, including the FA Cup, EFL Cup, and the Champions League. A trophy has been seemingly avoiding them for the longest time, but this season could be the change.

Positive Signs This Season

There are many factors suggesting that a title challenge is a very realistic possibility, with one of the most prominent being that they don't have any European football to distract them, in addition to already being knocked out of the EFL Cup. That 8th-place finish in the Premier League last season could have been a blessing in disguise, as fewer games means more recovery time for players, leading to better performances. Furthermore, Heung-Min Son and James Maddison have both picked up the Player of the Month award for September and August respectively, and Postecoglou won two Manager

of the Month awards in a row. The last manager to win two awards in the same season was Jurgen Klopp in 2019, and that was in a full season.

Spurs have also played Arsenal (2-2 D), Liverpool (2-1 W), and Manchester United (2-0 W). On the flip side of that, they have also played all three of the newly promoted teams, which seems to discredit their incredible start to the season.

Looking into more advanced stats, Spurs have had the most shots this season (153), third-most tackles (160), thirdmost passes (4,597),third-highest average possession (61.4%), the highest average rating for all players (7.35/10), and the second-highest goal-differential in the league behind Manchester City and Newcastle who have +11, and tied with Arsenal who has +10.

In addition to this, it looks like Postecoglou is the fix to all of Spurs' problems. He has changed their style of play, their mindset, and certainly the team spirit. Many Spurs fans would have wanted a high-profile name such as Julien Naglesmann to manage the club, but Postecoglou seems to be the perfect fit.

However, we have seen this before. This wasn't 20 years ago, 10

years, not even 3 years ago. Just last season, Spurs were having a similar start to the season at this campaign. They had the best start to an English League season since 1963. Kane was flying high with 8 goals in 10 games, as after matchday 10, Spurs were 3rd on 20 points behind Arsenal and Manchester City. Of course, they failed to keep this consistency, as they eventually finished in 8th place, which has been a trend for Spurs in recent years. This season, they have had an even better start, but does that mean they can keep the consistency going?

Consistency

Consistency has seemed to be the main problem for Spurs for many years, as they have been so close so many times, and always failed to achieve something. Sometimes Spurs can do the unthinkable, like the comeback against Ajax in the Champions League Semi-Final, 2019, and sometimes they can do stuff like losing the Premier League title to Leicester City in 2016 or getting knocked out of the FA Cup semi-final by Portsmouth in 2010, who would later get relegated in the Premier League with 19 points. This has led to a term

being used to describe when Spurs do something in a matter of unpredictability, that being 'Spursy'.

It is almost like we see this trend happening over and over again, season after season, with seemingly no way of Spurs getting a real shot at any good ti-tle. Last season's postmatch interview with Antonio Conte after a 3-3 draw with Southampton, seemed to perfectly sum up this point. "The problem is we have shown we are not a team. We are 11 players. I see selfish players. It is the same every season, no matter who the manager is. They're used to it here. Don't play for something important. They don't want to play under pressure. They don't want to play under stress. Tottenham's story is this." This led to him getting the sack, but what he said here seems to be a pattern in Spurs' history. There seems to be hope with Postecoglou being the new manager and bringing a new perspective to the team, but can a new manager simply make this big of a difference?

It can, as it has been shown many times. For example, Claudio Ranieri joined a releg-

- three point shooting - would be solved. Their gritty, defensive, and fundamental playstyle may again take them far, and maybe finally to the Larry O'Brien trophy.

The Phoenix Suns flared out of the second round of the NBA playoffs last season to the eventual champion Denver Nuggets in a competitive six games. After trading for scoring machine Bradley Beal this offseason, the Suns will have arguably the most dangerous trio of wing scorers ever. They upgraded from Deandre Ayton with Jusuf Nurkic; both players are strong offensive players, but Nurkic is superior on

defense. Outside of those four players the roster consists of Josh Okogie, Grayson Allen, Yuta Watanabe, and some fringe NBA players. A playoff series against the Suns will no doubt be a mainly offensive contest. If Devin Booker, Kevin Durant, and Bradley Beal can stay healthy and play tremendous minutes in the playoffs, the Suns are a team to look out for.

The 2021 Champion Milwaukee Bucks had an embarrassing outing the last playoffs, losing to the eighth seeded Heat in the first round. To be fair, Giannis Antetokounmpo was injured for a few games, and Khris Middleton missed the whole series. This offseason, they made their biggest trade acquisition in franchise history when they got Damian Lillard from the Portland Trail Blazers. Lillard is one of the most depression of dangerous shooters of all time from anywhere up to 35 feet from the basket. A pick-and-roll action with Lillard and Giannis projects to be the most dangerous play in the NBA next season and is unguardable in theory. The loss of Jrue Holiday is overstated as he has been on the decline and did not fulfill the Bucks offensive point guard duties to a Championship standard. Perimeter defense is unimportant when you have two First Team All-Defense towers in the paint: Brook Lopez and Giannis.

The Boston Celtics

have been the most consistent team in the NBA, and have been in the conference finals five of the last seven seasons. They had a very active offsea-son in the trade market, and seem to be all in on the Jayson Tatum and Jaylen Brown duo. First, they traded for star Kristaps Porzingis. Porzingis has the ability to be an all-NBA player in any given season, and the only thing that holds him back is health concerns. They also traded for Jrue Holiday, who will make up for the loss of Marcus Smart nicely. Though he is a marginal downgrade defensively, he makes up for that loss with his shooting ability. Derrick White is the best ball handler on the roster, and the best player to take the keys as the point guard. Starting him would either push Holiday out of the starting lineup or Porzingis to center, both unideal scenarios.

Those five teams are my picks for the most likely champions next season, but I don't doubt that other teams have boom potential. Lebron and Anthony Davis, surrounded by many boom or bust players, can win under the right conditions. Luke Doncic and Kyrie Irving may click and make it work under Jason Kidd. The elderly Clippers may find a fountain of youth and - if they stay healthy - become top contenders.

tion-fighting Leicester City and won the Prem the same season he joined. Klopp and Guardiola joined their respective Prem teams and created a dynasty of trophies and success. A good manager can make a huge difference, but it is too early to see if Postecoglou is that manager who can change everything for Spurs.

Other Title Contending Teams

Manchester City has been incredibly consis-

tent for the past decade or so, and many people think Manchester City can still win the title, even without key players like Kevin De Bruyne and Joao Cancelo. If anything, this season looks like the season Manchester City won't win the title, as they have lost their last two games coming into the international break. One to another title contender in Arsenal, but another to a potentially relegation-battling team in Wolves. Erling Haaland is their main man and has had a great start to the season, bagging 8 goals in 8 matches. It certainly looks like no one can stop him, but after having 0.00 expected goals against their 1-0 loss against Arsenal, it seems like he could be slowing down and not the same player he was last season.

Arsenal is the other main contender for the title, and they have a star-studded squad full of young talent who just missed out on the title last season. They are also the only undefeated in the Prem alongside Spurs and are on the same number of points and goal differential as Spurs, but behind on goals scored. They drew 2-2 against Spurs on matchday six and have arguably had a more difficult stretch of games in comparison to Spurs.

Wild Card Round:

Minnesota Twins vs. Toronto Blue Jays

The Al Central Champions Minnesota Twins (87-75) took two decisive wins over the Toronto Blue Jays in the three game wild card series, winning both games by the scores of 3-1 and 2-0 in games one and two respectively. Yet Another James Harden Trade Saga — The Philadelphia 76ers

Most NBA fans would agree that James Harden is one of the most controversial figures in the league. Harden, a tentime NBA All-Star and seven-time All-NBA player, is widely regarded as one of the league's greatest scorers, and he has proved his skill time and time again on the court. Drafted in the 2009 NBA Draft to the Oklahoma City Thunders (OKC) as the third overall pick, Harden instantly made an impact on the court, winning NBA sixth-man of the year and guiding OKC to the NBA finals in the 2011-2012 season.

Houston Rockets

However, Harden is most well-remembered during his era at the Houston Rockets, Harden was traded to Houston in 2012, where Daryl Morey, then Houston's general manager, believed he had the tools of a future superstar. Harden even told reporters the Rockets were "just not good enough." Finally, the Rockets had enough, and the next day, Harden was traded to the Nets to form a superteam with Kyrie Irving and Kevin Durant.

Brooklyn Nets

Harden's tenure at the Nets was underwhelming. Both Durant and Harden were plagued by on and off injuries, and even when they were healthy, Harden did not look like himself. The trio ended up playing just 16 games together across two seasons. And just like that, 13 months after his trade from the Rockets, Harden was pressing for another trade. He resisted making a formal request out of fear of public backlash for asking out once again, sources told ES-PN's Adrian Wojnarowski, but he wanted a trade to the Philadelphia 76ers to reunite with Morey, their current President. Harden missed his final few games from an injury, and on deadline day, he was

traded to the 76ers, with Ben Simmons coming the other way.

Philadelphia 76ers

Harden started off strong, forming a partnership with Joel Embiid and dropping numbers that somewhat resembled his time in Houston. He even declined a large contract and took a pay cut to enable the 76ers the salary cap flexibility to sign more role players like PJ Tucker. According to Wo-jnarowski, Harden told Morey that he wanted to do his part to fortify the team's roster and give it a chance to compete for a championship. However, in his second season as a 76er, Harden's numbers declined. After suffering another disappointing early exit from the NBA playoffs, and with Morey and the Sixer's front office refusing to give him a new lucrative contract, Harden wanted a trade again. However, this time was different. No one wanted him.

76ers Trade Request

Harden requested his trade back in late June, and over the course of the four months, Harden has already used most of his moves. In August, Harden publicly called Morey a "liar" and suggested he would not fulfill his contract with the 76ers as long as Morey remained President. The league fined Harden 100,000 dollars for that. Footage was shown of Harden displaying a 'Daryl Morey is a liar' sign in a bar where

he partied. Harden did not even show up to the 76ers media day, pre-season training, and pre-season games. And in the first pre-season game, young guard Tyrese Maxey balled out, cooking players, as if showing that there is no need for Harden. So, if no teams want Harden, where is he going to go?

Los Angeles Clippers

This week, new reports have shown that the Los Angeles Clippers are in fact interested in Harden. However, the Clippers already have stars Kawhi Leonard and Paul George, so why would they still want Harden? Apparently, the Clippers are in desperate need of a ball handler to general the court. Moreover, Kawhi and George have suffered multiple injuries throughout the season, and adding Harden would mean one more star to help the team out in case the others are injured.

the others are injured.
But why hasn't this trade happened yet? This is because the 76ers front office is not satisfied with what the Clippers are offering for him. The 76ers want Robert Covington, Terance Mann, and Marcus Morris for James Harden. This trio of floor-spacing forwards would be perfect for the 76ers, giving them multiple accurate shooting options, but why hasn't this deal gone through yet? Reports have said that Daryl Morey is in fact the one "holding up" a deal. Apparently, the Clippers consider Terrance Mann

untouchable and are unwilling to trade him. Yet Morey is unwilling to settle for any other deal. So, what does this mean for Harden?

Chinese National Swim Team Dominates at the 19th Asian Games in Hangzhou, China

During these past few weeks, swimmers worldwide watched some of the fastest athletes compete at the 2023 Asian Games. The 19th qua-drennial Asian Games were held in Hangzhou, China from Sentember China from September 23rd to October 8th. For many athletes, the Asian Games is considered to be the highest level of competition aside from Olympic the games. Swimmers train extensively in the hope of earning medals for their home country. The swimming events began on the 24th and concluded on the 29th. Team China, rallying up a total of 58 medals including 28 gold medals, outperformed the rest of the meet and presented one of the strongest and tastest teams in the world. Korea and Japan followed China to earn second and third in the Asian Games, only to earn less than half as many medals each. It was also the first time in history that Korea beat Japan in the medal table. The Asian Games were

highlighted by the blazing races of multiple Chinese athletes. Team China is often a country excluded from the discussion of world-class swimmers. Their most decorated athlete, Sun Yang, dominated mid-distance to long-distance events in the 2010s, winning a total of 6 medals at the Olympics including 3 gold medals. He also holds the current world record in the 1500m free-

style (14:31.02) which remains unbroken since it was set at the London Olympics. However, Sun Yang faced doping charges and was given an 8-year ban from swimming. For that reason, China remained out of the conversation in many competitions. Occasionally, names like backstroker Xu Jiayu were mentioned, yet China's performance at meets was overshadowed by the performances of Caleb Dressel, Ryan Murphy, Adam Peaty, and others. The recent performances of athletes like Qin Haiyang, Wang Shun, Zhang Yufei, and others have gained the attention of swimmers around the world and shone a new light on the future of swimming for China.

Qin Haiyang

After returning from the 2023 World Championships in Fukuoka with three world titles and a world record, Qin Haiyang's performance at the Asian Games did not disappoint. Qin completed the treble in the breaststroke again while breaking all three of the meet records for his events. He was just seven hundredths off his Asian record, with a slightly slower back half (31.07). Oin also decided to compete in the 200 IM (1:57.41), where he won the silver medal for China behind teammate Wang Shun.

Wang Shun

200 IM Olympic

gold-medalist Wang Shun also swam a lifetime best, breaking his own Asian record as he posted the top time this year in the 200 IM (1:54.62), ahead of superstar Leon Marchand's time at World Championships (1:54.82). Wang Shun also became the third fastest performer in history, behind the legendary Michael Phelps and Ryan Lochte. Despite rumors of Wang peaking at the 2021 Tokyo Olympics, Wang proved that he remained to be one the fastest swimmers in the world. "I said [before the Games] I'll let the flag rise at my home-town and I did it." Wang said, "For me, breaking my own Asian Record is more precious than the gold itself. Age is just a number. To all those people who said, I'm done, are you done now?"

Pan Zhanle

In the 100 Freestyle, Chinese teammate Pan Zhanle blasted a 46.97, putting him at the fifth fastest swim in history for this event. Pan Zhanle broke through earlier this year at the Chinese National Championships as an 18-year-old, going 47.22 and breaking the Asian record. Despite setting the fastest time of anyone this year, Pan was still "disappointed" that he couldn't break the world record set by David Popovic in 2022 (46.86). "I felt my performancé was average□ I was aiming to break the World Record before the race. It's a bit disappointing that I missed

it by only 0.1." He said in a post-race interview, "I will continue to strive towards the goal of breaking the World Record in the future." Outside of the 50 Free, Pan Zhanle also swam his best time in the 50 Free (21.92), winning a bronze medal for China. Going sub-22 for the first time, he has become the first swimmer in history to go sub-22 50 Free, sub-47 100 Free, and sub-1:45 200 Free.

Zhang Yufei

On the women's side, Olympic gold medalist and world champion Zhang Yufei won 4 gold medals in individual events, continuing her dominance in butterfly and sprint-free events. She broke the meet record in the 100 Fly (55.82) and was just two-tenths off her own Asian record. In a CCTV interview, Zhang Yufei stated, "I hope that I get better race after race, year after year, and do better at the Paris Olympics than how I performed at the Tokyo Olympics." She also mentioned that her preparation for the Paris Olympics will mainly be focused on improving her 200 fly which she won at the Tokyo Olympics in

Relay

Posting the second fastest time in history behind the 2021 USA relay with Caleb Dressel, the men's 400 Medley Relay was also a standout of the meet for Team China (Xu Jiayu: 52.05, Qin Haiyang:

57.63, Wang Changhao: 50.68, Pan Zhanle: 46.65, 3:27.01) as they shattered the Asian record. The same relay went 3:29.00 during the World Championships, winning a bronze medal for China. However, the Chinese relay could be a threat to the Americans, who have remained Olympic Champions in this event throughout history. The Mixed 400 Medley Relay was also a standout, as Xu Jiayu, Qin Haiyang, Zhang Yufei, and Yang Junxuan broke the Asian record by going 3:37.73. Xu Jiayu (51.91) split one of his fastest performances, going sub-51, while Qin Universe (57.20) delivered Haiyang (57.20) delivered another blazing breaststroke leg. The relay narrowly missed the world record set by Great Britain at the Tokyo Olympics (3:37.58).

MVP Awards

The MVP awards went to Zhang Yufei and Qin Haiyang for their stellar performances at the Asian Games. In an interview, Zhang told the press, "This award is a new milestone for me and will make me work harder for the Paris Olympics next summer." Qin, similarly, said that he will "aim for new highs in Paris next year," and expressed his aspiration to break Adam Peaty's legendary 100-meter Breast-stroke world record.
